TONE

• in artwork, tone refers to the colors/hues an artist uses to create emotion





MOOD


• The mood of the artwork is the effect the artist is trying to create. It's what the artist wants you to feel when you look at the work of art.

Making Connections

Writing is just like artwork. Writers want their readers to FEEL something and will use a variety of words and figurative language like similes/metaphors to create tone and mood.


TONE

• in literary work, refers to the writer's attitude towards a subject or topic

MOOD

 mood refers to the way a reader feels when reading a story or article.





What is the Tone & Mood of each passage?
